#### **Legacy and Will disputes**

- Should a resident inform the charity if they hold a Will and where it's held? Can a charity insist a resident write a Will?
  - Has the resident made a Will?
  - Is the Manager of the Almshouse aware of the existence of the Will?
  - Privacy and resident's discretion
- How does a charity deal with a resident's belongings if they pass away without a Will or next of kin?
  - Intestacy Rules
  - Bona Vacantia?
  - If unsure seek legal advice



# **Property related disputes**

- A charity suspects a resident has not been truthful on their application and they have a house or savings not declared, how can they investigate this?
  - Conduct a thorough review to the resident's application
  - Schedule a meeting with the resident to discuss
  - Check public records, credit searches etc
- How can a charity deal with a resident who refuses to let the charity or tradespeople they appoint to access the property to complete checks. Can a charity insist on entry?
  - Communication is key
  - Understanding the reasons
  - Check Letter of Appointment and seek legal advice if problem persists



#### **Property related disputes**

- What should a charity do if they suspect a resident is not using an almshouse as their main residence?
  - Gather evidence and check Letter of Appointment
  - Approach resident with sensitivity to understand any concerns
  - Consider termination of appointment if necessary
- Which types of behaviour from a resident can be a case for setting aside an appointment?
  - What constitutes 'anti-social behaviour'?
  - Watts –v- Stewart [2018] Ch 423



# **Property related disputes**

- How should a charity deal with a resident they suspect can no longer live independently?
  - Conduct thorough assessment
  - Identify key safety concerns and potential risks
  - Work with friends and family/support services
- A charity has given notice to a resident to vacate the property but they have not left the property on the specified date, what are the next steps?
  - Protection from Eviction Act 1977
  - Possession Proceedings under the Housing Act 1988
  - County Court bailiffs powers



# Other possible disputes

- Does an almshouse have to allow assistance dogs even if it does not allow pets?
  - Equality Act 2010
  - Reasonable adjustments
  - Potentially discriminatory to refuse
